

### The Essential Biblical Qualities for Trustworthy Leaders




A Christian leader takes the people of God, and others, on the *mission* of God the Father at the *direction* of God the Son in the *power* of God the Spirit.

#### Love:

Like Jesus: wash the feet of others (John 13:14; 15:13).

I.e. love as service.



#### Love:

This involves listening and praying (privately, quietly...). Managing people can be discipling them.



### Joy:

There can be joy lives even in great difficulty. Rejoice! (Eph 5:20)



Joy:

It helps people maintain a positive outlook.



#### Peace:

Our leadership is under Christ's leadership.

Peace:

It helps us to be a 'non-anxious presence'.

#### Peace:

Need to seek the Lord's guidance at every point.



#### Patience:

Giving time to others and self.

This is an aspect of love (1 Cor 13:4).

It takes time to build trust.



#### Kindness:

This can take courage.



#### Goodness:

Call to a holy life - often linked to generosity.



#### Goodness:

About sanctification that follows from justification.



Faithfulness:


About steady faith in God, and faithfulness to others.

#### Gentleness:

Exercising power without being overbearing. (Matt 20:25)



#### Gentleness:

Humility is what Christ demonstrates. (2 Cor 10:1)



Self-control:

Allowing the Spirit to bring our will into alignment with God's will for our lives.

It is a call to self-discipline and to follow-through.
